

Theme: What is God like?

God is like a Prodigal and Running Father

Bible Readings: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

As Jesus travelled towards Jerusalem and the cross, tax collectors and sinners came to listen to him. We even note that Jesus welcomed them and even shared meals with them. (Some say they were like the younger son in the parable Jesus was about to tell.)

The Pharisees and the scribes grumbled about this inappropriate behaviour by Jesus. (Some say they are like the older son in the parable).

Today we encounter the parable and ask "What is God like?" The father!!??

#### **Theme**

In his parables and teaching, in his life and his death, Jesus reveals to us the true nature of God. God is the Loving Father, the Prodigal Father, the Running Father, who receives us in our sin and shows mercy upon us, even in our sin.

### Prayer (by Rev William Willimon)

Almighty God, we confess that we have held many wrong ideas about you. We believed you to be almighty power, and yet you came to us in mighty love. We thought that you would not receive us in your righteousness, yet you received us in our sinful rags. We deserved your just and harsh punishment for unrighteousness, and you invited us to a joyous party.

We confess that you are not the God we expected. We thought that you desired our fear and respect, only to be surprised that you cherish our love and affection.

Bring us, in these forty days of Lent, to see the fullness of your glory, to acknowledge the depth of your love for us, and to respond to you as you are rather than as we feared you to be. Amen.

# LENT 4 Fourth Week on the Mountain

Begin this time of Listening Prayer by picturing again the transfiguration story. (You might like to read the story again. Luke 9:28-36.)

- Jesus is taking you up the mountain to pray.
   Become conscious of your breathing. In Hebrew "ruach" is the word that means "wind, breath, and/or spirit".
   So in your breath sense the Presence of Jesus.
- 2. In the quietness meditate on Jesus being transfigured before the disciples. Believe you are being changed by Jesus as the disciples were by the vision.
- 3. Hear the voice from the clouds saying This is my Son, my chosen; listen to Him. Lk 9:35
- Read the parable found in the Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32.
   Maybe you have a bible without titles. Good.
   If like mine your does have titles, try not to focus on this title.
- 5. Read the parable through again slowly. Then read and note, maybe even writing down, the number of times the father is mentioned and the role he plays.
- 6. There once was **a man** who had two sons. (15:11)
- 7. The younger son asked for his share of the property. The older son did not. The man (father) divided his property between them. (15:12)
- 8. But while he was still far off, his father *saw him* and was *filled with compassion;* he *ran* and *put his arms around him* and *kissed him.* (15:20)
- 9. Before the son can get his full confession out, the father interrupts him and says to his slaves Quickly, bring out a robe the best one and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate, for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found! And they began to celebrate. (15:22-24)

- 10. The older brother refused to come into the party. (15:25-28) *His father came out and began to plead with him. (15:28).*
- 11. The older son argued with his father (15:29-31) and his father replied, Son, you are always with me and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found" (15:32)
- 12. What do the words and actions of the father tell us about the nature of God?
- 13. Look at this drawing and the caption presented by Charlie Mackesy, a British artist, illustrator, and author.



During Lent there is challenge delivered to us all to repent, confess our sins and return to the Father. It may involve prayer, fasting and giving to those need,

This drawing, building on the father running to his son, suggests that God, the father is running towards you with compassion, to throw his arms around you and to kiss you. ((15:20)

How does this make you feel? God's extravagant love is for you.

#### Martin Luther once said:

Forgiveness is not an occasional art, it is a permanent attitude. In Lent we learn again that this is God's permanent attitude.
