

The VIBE

Theme: Letting God Do A New Thing

Bible Readings: Isaiah 43:16-21; John 12:1-8.

Our Isaiah reading for this Sunday is a call to the people in exile to look to the future with expectation of what God will do rather than keep dwelling on the past.

In the opening verses God reminds the people of what He did to the Egyptian army when it pursued the Children of Israel after they left Egypt. We need to note the words, "who drew out...." in verse 17 which means that God encouraged the Egyptians to pursue the Children of Israel before destroying them in the sea. In each verse of this reading it is what God is doing - to make a way in the desert and provide water for his people - a people that God chose and made for himself, not like other nations round about. These were a special people to proclaim God's praise.

Between Babylon and the land of Israel and Judah lay a desert that would have to be crossed. The people that would return to Jerusalem would be descendants of the original exiles. They had been born and raised in Babylon during a seventy-year exile and were used to city life on the banks of the Euphrates River. They would need to step out in faith, trusting God for the desert crossing and their reception in Judaea. For them, it would be a new thing.

Our Gospel reading is somewhat different in emphasis. Jesus and his disciples go to Bethany to stay before the Passover in Jerusalem. Lazarus and his sisters give a dinner in Jesus' honour. The men would be reclined around the table and Martha served them with the meal. Mary then did the unexpected by anointing Jesus' feet with about half-a-litre of pure nard, a perfume made from the dried roots of the spikenard plant in North India and therefore very expensive. Mary then wiped his

feet with her hair. It was normal for Jewish women to have their hair wound up and clipped on their head and not be hanging loose. Their head would normally be covered except in the presence of her husband and family alone. The reaction by Jesus was contrary to the others present, pointing the way for others to see things differently to what they had been used to. Amen.



A Lenten Reflection

In both readings we see the move of God in a way that challenges people's thinking. The exiles in Babylon were settled and had become part of the fabric of Babylonian society. We see this from the books of Nehemiah and Daniel. When King Cyrus overthrew the Babylonian empire he allowed the exiles to return to their own country. About 42,000 Jews travelled to Judah but many stayed in Babylon. The offer by Cyrus would have required people to re-think their priorities in life and what God was calling them to do and be.



Similarly, in the Gospel reading, those present at the dinner in Lazarus' home would have been shocked at Mary's behaviour. Jesus saw things differently.

At this Lenten time it is good for us to reflect on our faith and our priorities in life. How do they fit in with God's priorities and do we need to make some changes?


